We concluded the 74th Annual Pikes Peak or Bust Rodeo in record fashion. Saturday night, July 12 was the final performance of our five performance series, and sell out crowds enjoyed every minute of the action. The new format was exciting, fast-moving and filled with top-ranked cowboys and cowgirls competing for record prize money. The last performance featured a Super Shootout and Championship Shootout culminating in awarding seven winners with a \$15,000 first place check and an invitation to Rodeo Houston and the semi-finals of The American.

The contestants raved about the top prize money, the new format and how welcomed they and their families felt by coming to our Rodeo. After each performance the winners spent time signing autographs and having photos taken with their fans.

This success was made possible in large part due to our recent partnership with Cinch Jeans & Shirts as our title sponsor. The support of our loyal sponsors and the addition of some new sponsors grew our total sponsor community by 12%, with sponsorship funding growing by 30%.
